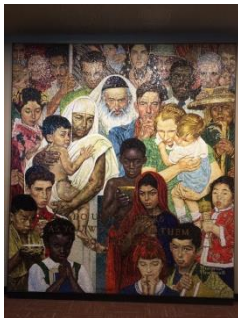
For more background about who we are, the Human Rights Special Interest Group (HR-SIG) is a non-profit, research-based, independent entity. Our mission is to inspire local community efforts to educate, advocate, and implement international human rights policies and goals.

Our members came together a few years ago while serving as representatives of the League of Women Voters to the UN Commission on the Status of Women (CSW). Subsequently, we organized the HR-SIG as an independent entity to expand our outreach not only to local and State Leagues, but also to other civic groups and associations.

The first work product from HR-SIG is the *Briefing Book on Human Rights, First Edition 2019-2020: Synergy Between Policies of the League of Women Voters and United Nations Human Rights Conventions* (copy available at your request). Our second Briefing Book (available later this year) is entitled, *Human Rights Approach to Achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals*. In addition, we have consulted on such human-rights related topics as the ERA, voting rights, freedom from torture, and climate migration.
