4. Voter Guides: Leslie disseminated throughout the community the LWVOR voter guides that were in Spanish and in English.

B. Observer Corp: Griffin has made some observations but has not yet sent them to the OC committee because she has been out of town. Members agreed to continue OC and Leslie will write a note to post in the LWVKC newsletter encouraging more volunteers to observe and report on various governmental meetings. Emily may not be an observer as she may become a city council member to replace the winner, Gary Hedlund, as he resigned and the council will now appoint someone. Emily won the second highest votes so she may be appointed. Diane will draft a letter asking for the council protocol for board appointments to be clarified.

- C. Website: Emily described updates to the LWVKC website server host. She offered to create dedicated email accounts for officers. She was asked to provide information on website page views and overall traffic at an upcoming meeting. Discussion ensued on how LWVKC can better use social media for better outreach to the Klamath community.
